To Whom It May Concern:

The Amador Fire Protection District is pleased to provide this letter of support for the Rancheria Ridge and Crestview Fuel Breaks grant proposal by the Amador Fire Safe Council (AFSC). This grant is an important component of the multiple-organization, strategically planned mosaic of fire mitigation and preparedness in Amador County. Implementation of this grant will fund 165 acres of fuels reduction work on two key Bureau of Land Management (BLM) properties in central Amador County.

The Crestview Fuel Break is a critical addition to the established Mitchell Mine Fuel Break and will provide significant protection to the town of Pine Grove. This 18-acre parcel is adjacent to Pine Grove School and within the Wildland Urban Interface of a densely populated rural community. Although a relatively small treatment area, this project ties into the functioning 10.4-mile Mitchell Mine Fuel Break.

The Rancheria Ridge Fuel Break is a roughly 2.5-mile fuel break that will provide critical fire protection to many rural communities and the towns of Sutter Creek, Amador City, and Volcano. In the 1960's the Rancheria Creek Fire burned over 30,000 acres and destroyed 30 buildings. Due to rural development in the county, if this fire were to burn the same footprint over 450 homes would be destroyed; due to increased fuel loading in the area would likely have a great intensity. This Rancheria Ridge Fuel Break could provide protection from a fire with a similar trajectory.

We are in full support of AFSC's fire prevention efforts. We recognize the AFSC is working hard to reduce hazardous fuel loading throughout the county. This includes working on privately owned as well as federally managed lands.

We present this letter in support of the AFSC application for fuels reduction on BLM properties in the County. The Amador Fire Protection District looks forward to our continued partnership with the Amador Fire Safe Council and to a more fire-resilient landscape in our future.

Ordinance No. AFPD 008, establishing a First Responder Fee for Emergency Medical Services between Wittman and Amador Fire Protection District was dully passed and adopted by a unanimous vote on May 21, 2019.

Wittman charges AFPD \$14.00 per patient medical emergency. The cost was raised by \$1.50/per on July 1, 2023. The District is reimbursed by the individual's insurance carrier directly in the amount of \$229.

During the last three years, there has been very few requests from individuals who received medical services that expressed financial hardship, at which time, the Fire Chief approved to not pursue collection of fees.

Joint Operations Agreement between the Amador Fire Protection District and the Lockwood Fire Protection District signed and dated July 19th, 2022

This addendum addresses the desire of the Lockwood Fire Protection District Board of Directors to enter into a mutually beneficial agreement of fulfilling the duties of Fire Chief for the Lockwood Fire Protection District by delegating those duties to the Fire Chief of the Amador Fire Protection District, who will delegate these duties to the Deputy Chief of the Amador Fire Protection District.

This addendum does not in any way change the current Joint Operations Agreement or preclude the Lockwood Fire Protection District from remaining an independent special district, with its own duly elected Board of Directors. This addendum allows for the Deputy Fire Chief of the Amador Fire Protection District to serve as Lockwood's Fire Chief, and to fully discharge those duties as required and outlined below:

- 1. Respond to emergency and non-emergency calls, deploying fire apparatus and fire personnel in the most advantageous manner for the control and extinguishment of fire.
- 2. Demonstrate leadership and effective supervision under unusually stressful conditions in both emergency and non-emergency situations.
- 3. Provide administrative oversight and participate in the development of policies and procedures supporting overall fire district administration and operations.
- 4. Working with the Treasurer and the Board of Directors to submit requests for new acquisitions and work within the established fire district budget, including the procurement of equipment and supplies. Follow District procedures for documenting expenditures. Assist the Board and Treasurer with annual budgeting of District operational and personnel expenses.
- 5. Ensure an adequate number of trained and equipped volunteer firefighters are available for emergency response.
- 6. Ensure all LFPD apparatus and facilities are well maintained, response ready, and presentable for the public.
- 7. Effectively promote and enforce a work environment that is free of discrimination or harassment of any kind, with zero tolerance for any such behavior or act.
- 8. Identify problems early and taking appropriate action when problems arise, thereby fulfilling supervisory responsibilities as required by law while adhering to LFPD policy and procedures.
- Promote safe work practices and provide a safe work environment for all volunteers and the public.
- 10. Plan, organize, direct, control and evaluate all Fire District operations for fire suppression, training, communications, prevention, fire investigation and emergency medical response.
- 11. Develop and maintain an effective public information and education program for the community members of the Lockwood Fire Protection District and surrounding area with the goal of

supporting a safer community. Cooperate with the Board and the Lockwood Auxiliary to actively promote a positive image of LFPD to the community.

- Work cooperatively with allied agencies and neighboring jurisdictions for the benefit of LFPD in providing effective and efficient emergency responses.
- 13. Remain current in modern fire protection organization standards and management practices used to deliver structural fire protection and other emergency services.
- 14. Utilize contemporary methods of emergency incident management including the Incident Command System for fire and non-fire related emergencies.
- 15. Provide supervision and oversight of the care, maintenance, application and replacement of personal protective equipment, mobile equipment, facilities, infrastructure and other equipment, to include an accurate inventory of equipment as appropriate.
- 16. Remain current and well versed in various state, local, and federal laws, codes and ordinances relating to life hazard, fire hazard and risk reduction policies.
- 17. Respond promptly to complaints or concerns from citizens, with the goal of determining reasonable solutions for all parties, including the District.
- 18. Represent LFPD's interests in various County organizations as appropriate.
- 19. The JOA shall be revisited upon any personnel changes regarding the Fire Chief position for AFPD.

The Lockwood Fire Protection District agrees to reimburse the Amador Fire Protection District for the fulfillment of Fire Chief duties at a rate of \$3,500.00 per month. The Lockwood Fire Protection District agrees to provide a command vehicle to be used for the official business of both districts. Amador Fire Protection District and Lockwood Fire Protection District will share the cost of operating the command vehicle. Lockwood will pay for the insurance and routine maintenance of the vehicle and Amador Fire will pay the fuel cost associated with operating the vehicle.

This addendum may be revoked or canceled by either party with a 30-day written notice. All equipment, documentation or other property of LFPD or Amador Fire shall be returned to the respective owners within 30 days of written notice of cancellation.

SCI's response to Board of Directors questions pertaining to the Resolution Addendum of Existing Agreement with SCI to direct bill property owners that do not receive a property tax bill:

- 1. Is AFPD legally permitted to not bill said properties?
 - i. AFPD is not required to make alternative arrangements to bill properties for which the County does not send a tax bill. Prop 218 states that if a parcel receives special benefits from a service, it shall not be exempt from assessment. By initially requesting the County bill said properties, AFPD has made reasonable efforts to assess all such properties.
- 2. Are there any legal ramifications to pick and choose who may receive a direct bill from the list?
 - i. SCI interpretation of Prop 218 is that the District has made its reasonable effort to assess all benefiting properties by initially requesting the County levy the AFPD assessments on all such properties. If the District finds that certain properties for which the County will not send a tax bill are worth pursuing, the District is within its rights and Prop 218 to selectively bill directly these properties. For example, the District may find that the cost of contracting for direct billing of all such properties is prohibitive.
- 3. 3. If the BOD does NOT approve the addendum but would like the District to process inhouse directly with the direct charges - when could we receive instructions and procedures to process the direct billing of benefit assessment for said properties?
 - i. SCI can provide instruction within the next 30 days from a BOD decision not to approve the addendum.

SCI is proposing sending direct bills to property owners with combined assessments of all their properties of at least \$15. For reference, below is a list of the owners and their assessments.

ADDENDUM TO ASSESSMENT ENGINEERING SERVICES AGREEMENT

The Consultant Assessment Engineering Services Agreement between the **Amador Fire Protection District**, a public agency, ("District") and SCI Consulting Group ("Consultant" or "SCI"), a California Corporation, is amended as follows:

- Scope of Work. District and Consultant entered into a previous Assessment Engineering Services & Election Professional Services Agreement, which included pricing for annual administration of the assessment if approved by property owners ("Assessment") but did not include the cost of manually billing properties for which the County does not send a property tax bill. In consideration of the District paying SCI for these services, SCI will provide the following manual billing services:
 - a. For any parcels that cannot be collected on County tax bills, prepare a listing of property owners, addresses, property information, current assessment amount and delinquent Assessments.
 - **b.** Directly invoice any such property owners with annual assessments totaling at least \$15 for the assessment amounts due for their property, record payments received in a payment tracking database, produce periodic reports for the District of bills paid and those still outstanding, and assist the District with collection of delinquent assessments.
- 2. Fees. The fees for the additional Scope of Work for these services is as follows:
 - a. \$1,900 for manual billing in Fiscal Year 2023-24. This includes a one time initial set up fee of \$500.
- 3. Term. This Addendum shall take effect immediately and shall continue in effect until completion of the Work.
- 4. Duplicate Counterparts. This Addendum may be executed in duplicate counterparts. The Addendum shall be deemed executed and shall be incorporated into the Original Agreement when it has been signed by both parties.
