



Information for preplanning and public understanding between an Evacuation Warning and an Evacuation Order in the event an evacuation was advised within Amador County:

Evacuation Advisory/Warning: It would be wise to consider planning and/or packing if an evacuation becomes necessary.

- You should prepare now by packing necessary items and preparing your family, pets, and vehicle for potential departure.

The 6 – P's to remember:

1. **Plan** for the persons in your family (have a meeting place planned)
 2. **Personal** items (Toiletries, food, water for 2-3 days, personal possessions)
 3. **Prescriptions** – Have your full, current supply of prescriptions packed.
 4. **Photographs** – and other mementos which cannot be replaced.
 5. **Pets** (Have a plan in place to secure pets in the vehicle so frightened pets don't escape while you are loading up)
 6. **Papers** – Pack all important papers, including reference phone numbers, account numbers, etc.
- During an advisory make plans and consider moving persons with mobility/medical issues.
 - During an advisory if you have livestock or large animals, please move them to a safe place.
 - Please use common sense and evacuate at any time you feel uncomfortable or see active fire behavior.

Mandatory Evacuation Order: Occupants of the affected area(s) are asked to leave within a specified time period, by pre-designated route(s). Perimeter roadblocks are typically established with law enforcement helping direct traffic. At this time:

- You should take your family, pets, and necessary items including medications and important papers, and evacuate now. Have your go-bag with you that will have drinking water and other personal items like the ones listed above.
- Check in with your local shelter (even if you don't intend to stay there) letting them know where you will be in case family is looking for you.
- Drive with your lights on, safely and SLOWLY remaining aware of your surroundings as you leave. Roads will be congested with traffic and could have low visibility, do not panic.
